What You Need to Know

You use math all the time. You can add numbers. You can subtract them. But there is more to math than just that!

Telling time is also a math skill. A **digital clock** shows the time in numbers. An **analog clock** shows the time with moving hands.





There are 24 hours in a day. The hours in a day are split into two groups.

The first 12 hours of a day are known as a.m. hours. These hours start at midnight.

At noon, the p.m. hours begin.
