The nose on a male *mandrill* turns bright red when this monkey wants to say, "Stop! Look at me!"



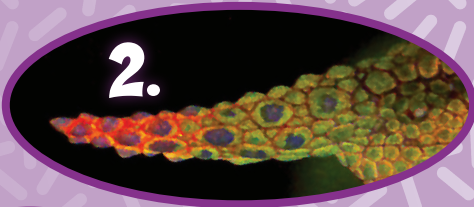
Alarm
