They also use their trunks to talk to each other. A **female** may pat another with her trunk to say, "How's it going?"

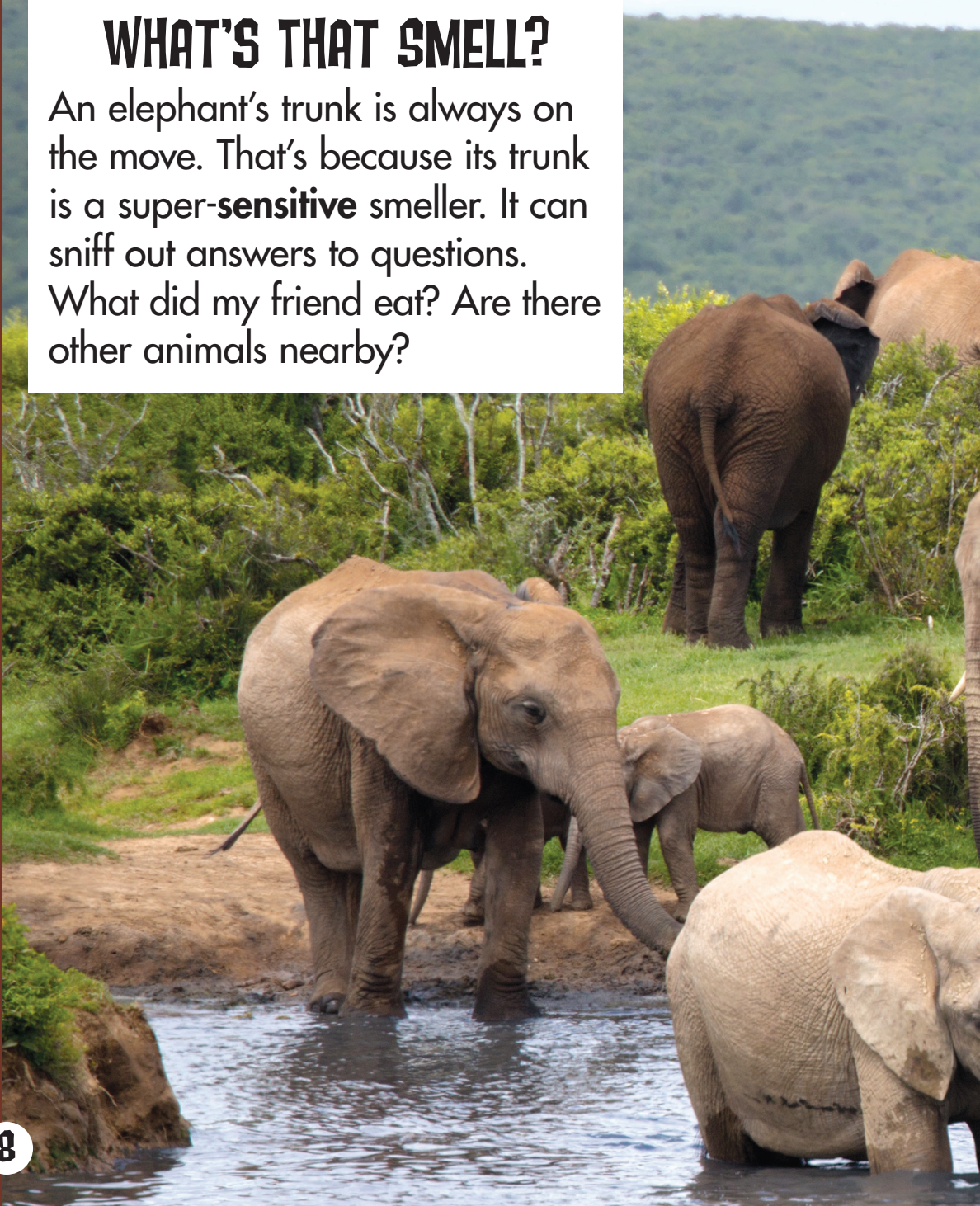
A **male** may twist his trunk around a female's to say, "I like you!"

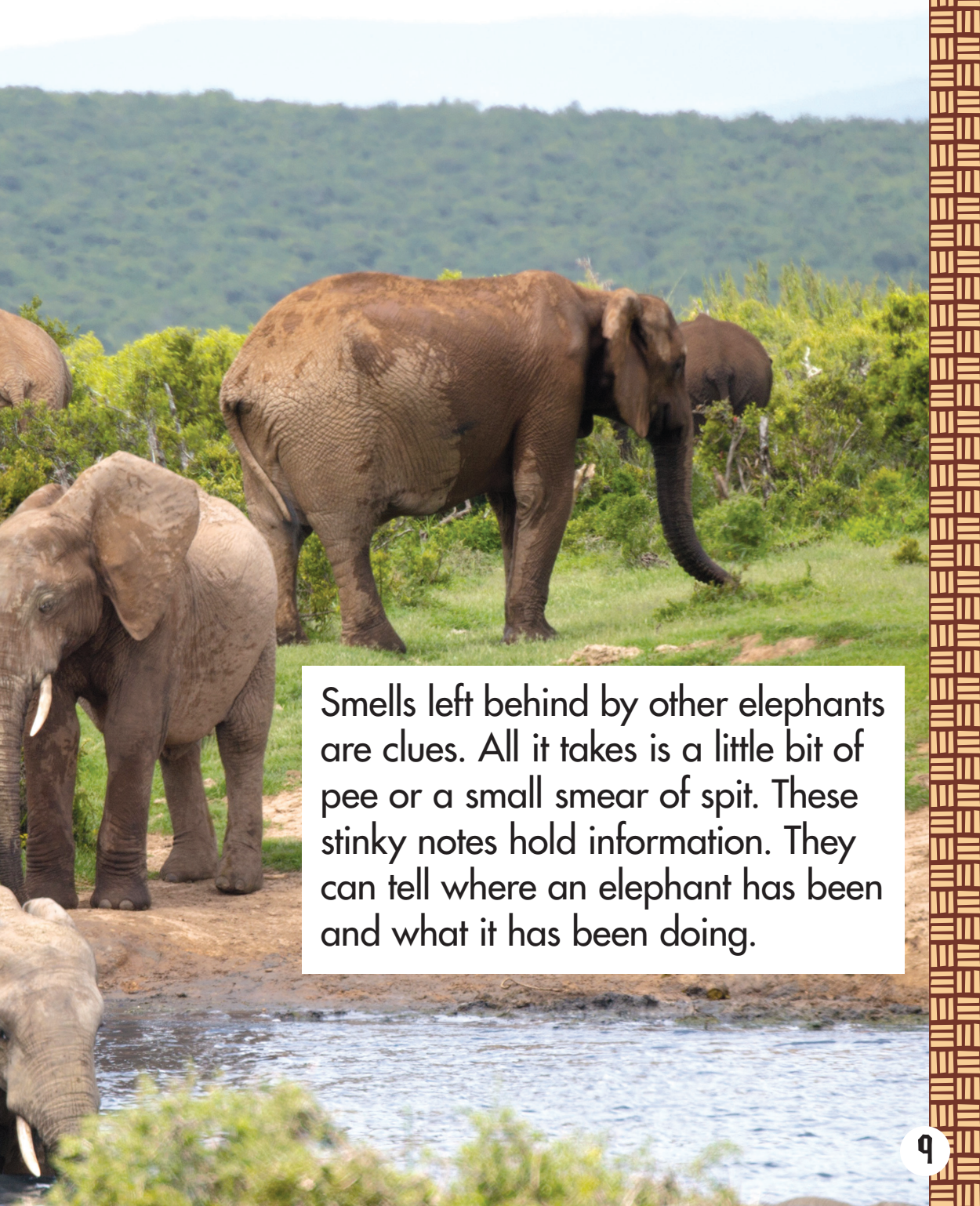
One elephant may use its trunk to shove another to say, "Back off! You're getting on my nerves." Who needs words when you have a trunk?



WHAT'S THAT SMELL?

An elephant's trunk is always on the move. That's because its trunk is a super-**sensitive** smeller. It can sniff out answers to questions. What did my friend eat? Are there other animals nearby?





Smells left behind by other elephants are clues. All it takes is a little bit of pee or a small smear of spit. These stinky notes hold information. They can tell where an elephant has been and what it has been doing.
